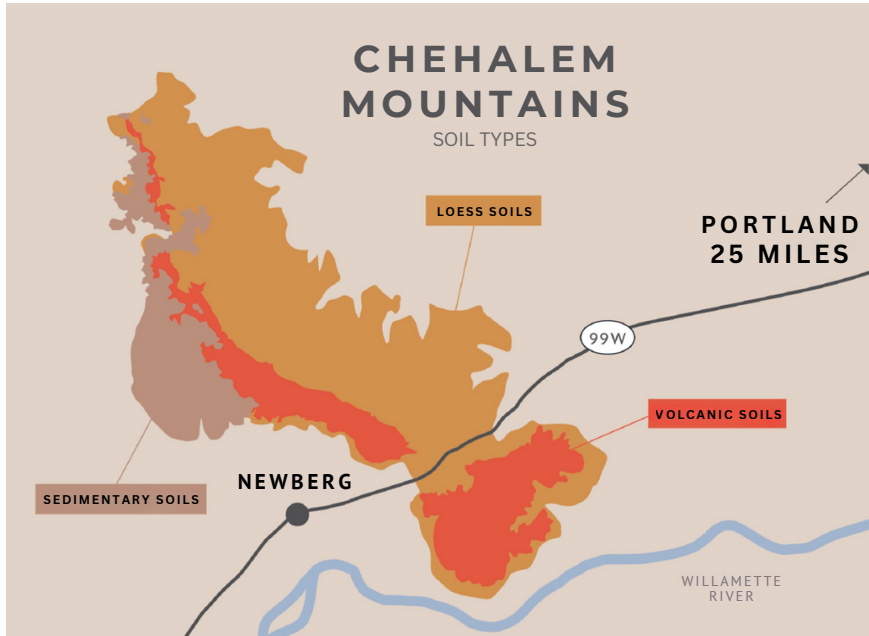




CHEHALEM MOUNTAINS WINEGROWERS

One of six original sub-AVAs or American Viticultural Areas contained within the original Willamette Valley AVA (est. 1984).

Diverse Soils & High Elevations

Uplifted sedimentary seabeds, lava flow, and wind-blown silt, creates some of the most diverse soils in wine country. At its peak, the Chehalem ridgeline boasts the Willamette Valley's tallest point at 1,633 feet above sea level.

Expansive Reach

Encompassing over 100 square miles, our AVA is one of the largest in the Willamette Valley and touches three counties (Yamhill, Washington, and Clackamas). Two nested AVAs give more nuanced identities to this diverse place.

Established in 2006, this AVA is home to over 50 wineries and a patchwork of over 100 vineyards all creating a diverse style of wines from the Willamette Valley's most renowned grapes.
